Our History

Boulder Valley Health Center was started in 1973 as Boulder Valley Women’s Health, following the verdict on Roe v. Wade that legalized abortion nation-wide. We have been serving the Boulder community for over 50 years, and are proud to be your community health clinic.

2025 Impact



Our patients are at the core of everything we do, and our impact reflects BVHC's essential role in the community and beyond. This year, thousands of patients sought compassionate, nonjudgmental sexual and reproductive healthcare at our center. While abortion care demand has fluctuated year to year, the post-Dobbs landscape continues to shape how, when, and from where patients seek care—placing new and sustained pressures on our staff, services, and physical space.

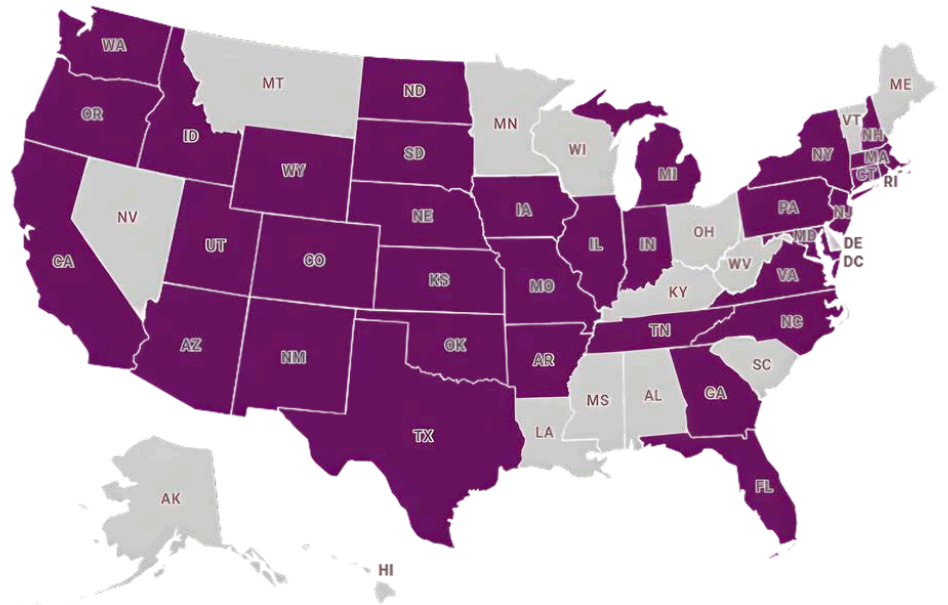

States Our Patients Traveled From



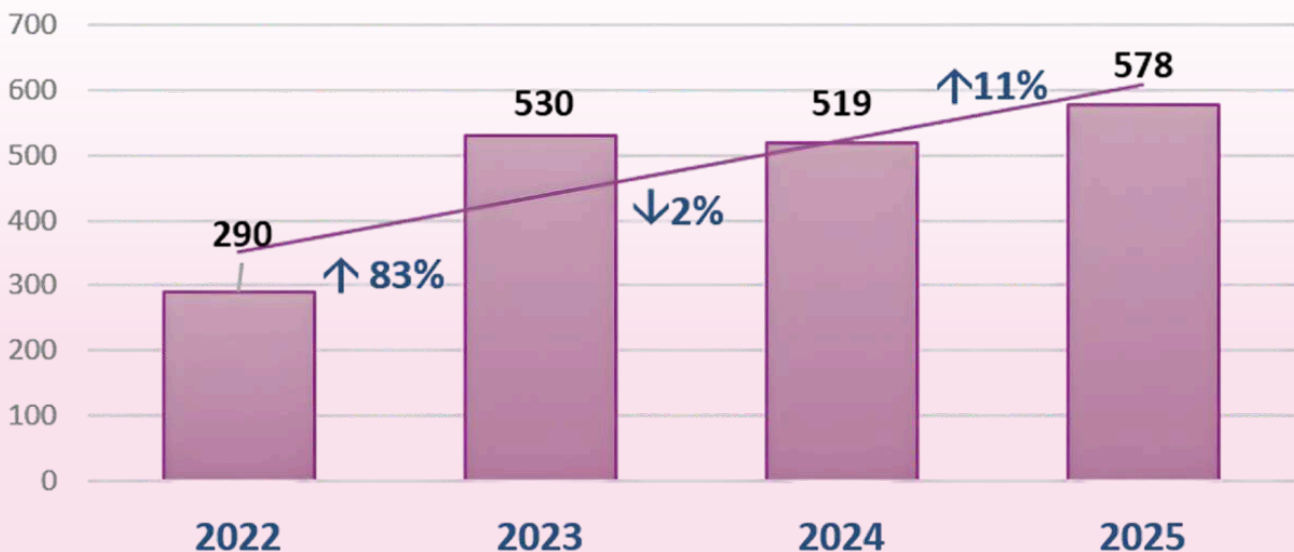

Over the past year, we have seen a significant increase in patients traveling from out of state as bans and severe restrictions on abortion particularly took effect. This influx underscored the critical role our organization plays as a trusted provider and safe point of access during a time of profound uncertainty.

*BVHC is a national resource for all people needing care, whether that is a CU student or a person traveling from out of state, we serve residents and nonresidents with high-quality and compassionate care.

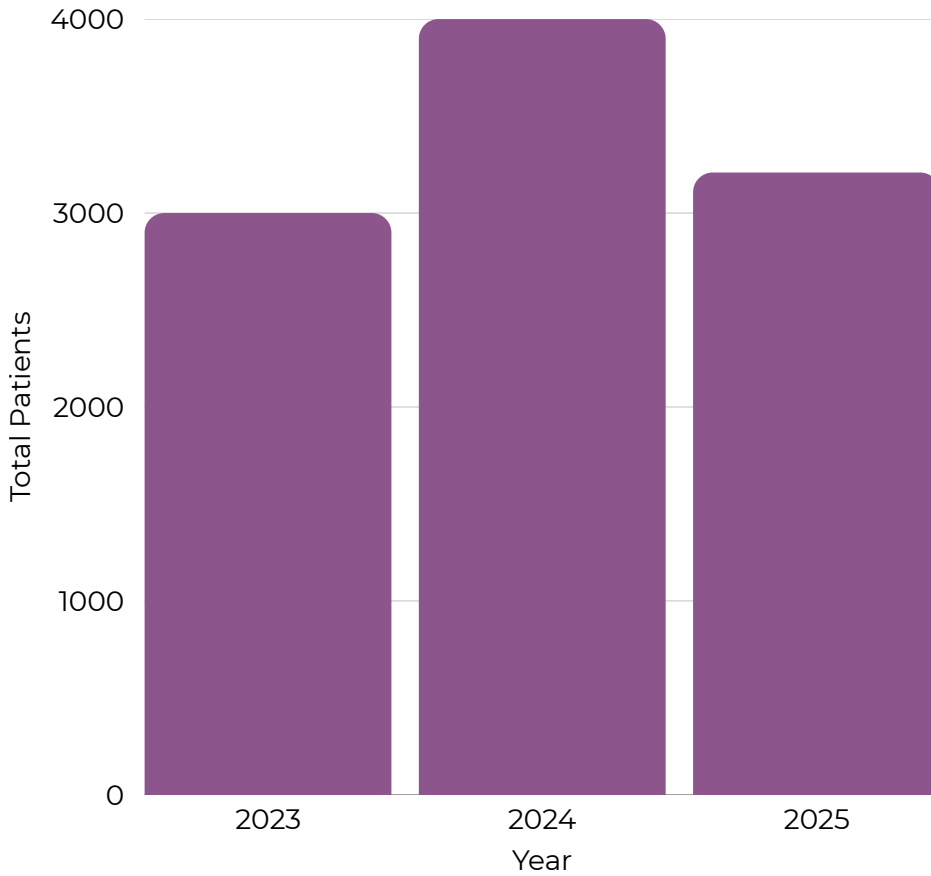
Visits for Abortion Care 2022 - 2025

Why the Drop?

Our overall patient numbers dropped in 2025, most notably for reproductive health services. The main 3 factors contributing to this are potential patients having safety concerns given the political climate, issues we faced with our online scheduling platform in the summer, and insurance companies refusing to cover crucial care. We are combatting this in 2026 with renewed fervor in increasing our organizational visibility and accessibility.

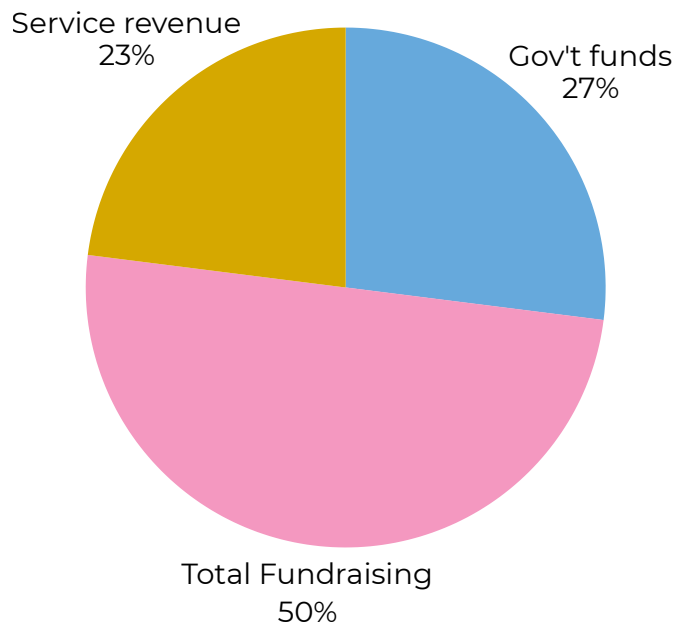

Why the Deficit?

While BVHC ended the year with an operating deficit, that deficit was reduced compared to 2024, reflecting improved financial performance and more efficient operations. 2025 was a year of restructuring and evaluation, during which we made intentional investments in strategic planning, internal systems, and operational improvements to strengthen our long-term sustainability. In 2026 we are renewing our focus on community visibility to grow patient volume and strengthen earned revenue.

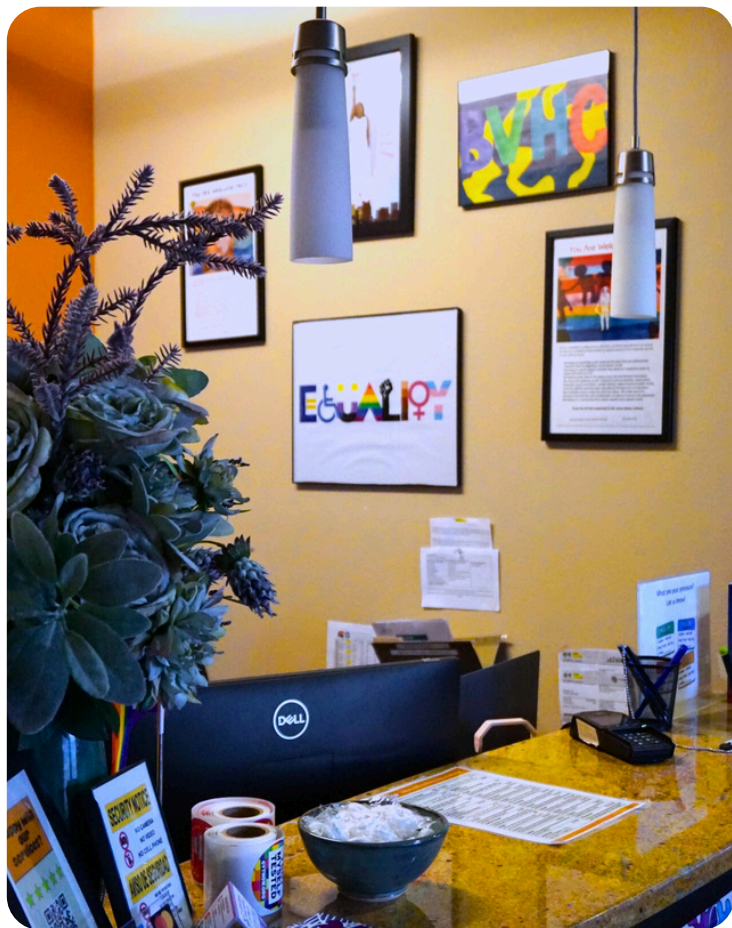
